The first thing you'll notice in the drawing is the length of the screen. This drawing is just a little out of porportion..but the display screen of The CoCo Registry is actually 128 columns wide. That's 48 more characters than the screen we usually use. Now the CoCo cannot really display all those extra characters at one time, so you will press the left arrow or the right arrow to choose which part of the screen is in the viewing window. I've tried to place the items on the screen so that all relavant data can be viewed relavanc together.

Various areas of the display give you bits of information that you may want to know. Such as: you can find out how many records are in the database, which record number is currently displayed, and the source of the data.

The options of The CoCo Registry are found in the area marked "MAIN MENU". You can choose to display specific classes of records by using the "MAKE A SEARCH TEMPLATE". Say you want to find everyone interested in GRAPHICS, just press #1, mark GRAPHICS, and then press #2 to "SEARCH AND SHOW". Only records with an interest in graphics will be displayed. The neat thing is you can use multiple search items. For example, you may want to know how many people in California are interested in FESTS and have a CoCo2. Just set the SEARCH TEMPLATE (#1), mark these three items, then SEARCH AND SHOW.

Now suppose you want to print out labels for the letters you might wish to send those folks. First you should SET PRINTER BAUD RATE (#5) correctly. Then press #3 to print out single labels or press #4 to print out 3 across labels.

You'll find The CoCo Registry useful, easy to use, and a lot of fun.

If you'll notice the enclosed drawing you'll see what happens as you move the highlighted bar thru the NAME SCROLL BOX. In my drawing William Rosenfeld's name is highlighted. The records for William will be very quickly displayed in the following boxes: THIS RECORD, INTERESTS, SUPPORT, and SYSTEM. The display is so fast I had to put a substantial time delay in the scrolling routine.

The CoCo Registry is designed to hold over 500 records in one "book". One side of the disk can hold two "books". My goal is to fill it up!

So this brief description should peak your interest and I believe you'll be most pleased when you receive your first issue of The CoCo Registry! Rendering of the 128 column CoCo Registry screen
