Taking CoCo into the 21st Century

A new goal has been recently adopted by Rick's Computer Enterprise and the Friends of CFDM. That is the preservation of the CoCo hobby into the 21st Century! The CoCo's birth, about 16 years ago, was a real boon to those who desired to learn about this new phenomena called the "home computer." Not that the ticket was inexpensive, but it was then possible for thousands to actually own a computer and learn how to use it. I believe it can be easily verified that many of those who presently make their living with computers can trace their introduction and education back to our little CoCo.

The easy to read instructional books and the simple nature of the CoCo made it possible for the user to actually learn how to program the machine! This aspect of home computing has virtually disappeared with the modern power boxes that are found in our homes today.

For about ten years thousands upon thousands of ordinary folks found great pleasure in the CoCo and in following the product development and the growth of the CoCo Community. Then, it seems, the rug was pulled very quickly as support from Tandy and the major publications ended. Today only a few hundred CoCoists are known to the community. Probably fewer than a thousand can be identified as supporters of the remaining clubs and publications. There may be that many more who still use the CoCo, but do not know about the existing community.

But we still carry on with viable support for an enthusiastic group and we have made it our goal to carry the CoCo into the 21st Century. With the advent of the CoCo 3 Emulator, created by Jeff Vavasour, and the new PCFDM, a PC disk magazine dedicated to the CoCo, the way has been paved for many who once knew the CoCo to return some support and help us make our goal a reality.

The CoCo 3 Emulator

The 'significant' CoCo related program of the 1990's has got to be the CoCo 3 Emulator from Jeff Vavasour. If you have a PC and you haven't ordered your copy, you really should! The Emulator is a PC program which when executed will make your PC into a CoCo. And...if you have a fast PC, you'll have a faster CoCo than the original. Speeds of 3 to 5 times that of the real CoCo are now possible. Also, if you have enough PC RAM, your Emulator will be a 512K CoCo. No need for a memory upgrade on the Emulator!!

Other features are four software disk drives, a Snapshot option, PC<>CoCo transfer option, and other menus "inside" the Emulator to allow you many other neat options. Also included are RETRIEVE and DSKINI software which will allow you to "move" your CoCo disks to the PC (for use by the Emulator or even by PC programs) and "move" your PC files to CoCo disks. And there's more that I can't begin to mention here.

The Emulator is available only from Jeff Vavasour. The price is \$25. Please note that the needed CoCo ROM files are not included, but software is included which lets you make copies from your "real" CoCo and "move" them to your PC.

CFDM is a monthly disk magazine for the CoCo3. CFDM has been a monthly for 50 months, and will continue as a monthly until June 1996. At that time we will begin publishing as a quarterly, four times per year. You can get the last four monthly issues, #50-53, for \$20...or...you may get the first quarterly year, which starts in September 1996, for \$30. Each issue of the monthly is a flippie diskette with the magazine on side 1 and our programs, music, and graphics on side 2. With every third issue you'll get a bonus disk with more programs, music, and graphics. When quarterly publication begins, you'll receive the regular flippie with each issue, plus a bonus disk and a copy of CFDM HARDCOPY. HARDCOPY is a professionally printed paper version of the CFDM magazine side. We have about 170 subscribers to CFDM at present.

We want you in our group....please join today!!

PCFDM is our new PC disk magazine which contains 99% CoCo material. This disk will include information from CFDM, CoCo 123 (the Glenside newsletter), the Adventure Survivors newsletter, a Delphi Report, and an Emulator Report. The Delphi section will feature an article by Marty Goodman and other news from Delphi. The Emulator Report will feature articles from Jeff Vavasour. And there's more.... PCFDM will be a quarterly and each subscription will start with issue #3 and run thru issue #6. You can subscribe to PCFDM for only \$30 for these four issues.
