WELCOME HOME!



Welcome to CF83 FORTH

The OTHER Operating System

If you are one of the first 300 attendees here at the Second Annual Last Chicago CoCoFest, then you have received a free copy of the CF83 Forth Disk with the 1983 Standard Forth Required Words Set.

To find out how to use your new operating system, just put the disk in your default drive (usually Drive 0) and enter: RUN"READER". Then just follow the instructions at the bottom of the screen. READER displays the CF83 Forth Manual 1/3 page at a time. The information at the bottom of the screen tells you which page you are on and which third of that page you are viewing. You can move up and down through the manual one third of a page at a time by using the up and down arrow keys. You can advance to the next full page by pressing the right arrow key, and you can move back to the top of the previous page by pressing the left arrow key. The G key allows you to GO directly to a page number you specify (after a slight delay). The P key sends the page you are currently viewing to your printer. It sends the whole page, regardless of which third of the page you are viewing. The R key lets you send a range of pages to the printer, and the D key lets you send the entire manual. The S key switches you to the Print Parameters Menu where you can toggle through the various parameters in each category by repeatedly pressing the key for that category. If you do something wrong, READER may jam up or do a diagnostic dump to the screen. If this happens, just turn your CoCo off and start over.


Allen Huffman and Joel Hegberg will speak on programming techniques and answer questions from the audience. Joel is fluent in several languages such as Basic, Assembly and C.
