



HARD DRIVE AVAILABLE FOR COCO

Tom Roginski of Owl-Hare demonstrates his new HARD DRIVE system for the Radio Shack Color Computer at the August meeting of PJ-CCC. Pictured at left is a close-up of the hard drive with multi-pak interface. "Disk access is at least 5 times faster than with floppy drives," says Tom. Introductory price for the 5 meg system (19,500+ sectors) is \$495 and \$649 for the 10 meg system (39,100 sectors). Interface and software is an additional \$99. You must have a multi-pak or Y-cable to be able to use the hard drives. See Tom at the meeting if you are interested and be maybe he'll give you a special discount for being a PJ-CCC member.

Anyone who has Adventure games is encouraged to bring them to the meeting since no scheduled program has actually been set up.


