

TANDY Color Computer 3

After numerous rumors for more than a year, Radio Shack (TANDY) introduced the NEW COLOR COMPUTER 3 last month to an awaiting CoCo following. According to local Radio Shack stores, the new CoCo won't be available till September 15 and maybe a little earlier in the computer centers.

The Color Computer 3 was introduced at the same time as five models of Tandy IBM compatibles which of course received all the publicity and the Color Computer didn't even get a mention in most national news publication.

But the September issue of Rainbow Magazine was held up briefly and some stories left out to include the information on the CoCo 3. Great job RAINBOW.

Well the specs for the Color Computer 3 are as follows:

- \$ 125K RAM standard, upgradable to 512K in one step only (according to RAINBOW).
 - \$ 64 different colors, 16 available at a time.
- # Graphics resolution of 640 by 192 in four colors or 320 by 192 in 16 colors if used with a monitor capable of producing high resolution graphics.

FINAL FIX KIT FOR SALE

Tom Castronuova has a "Final Fix" kit available as described in last month's 6809 EXPRESS. Tom decided not to install his final fix, since he was under the impression that it would clear up his video display. He apparently doesn't have problems like I had with random characters coming on the screen after the CoCo warms up. Since I installed my final fix kit under the tutoledge of Jerry Behler, I haven't had any problems with my old grey CoCo.

Anyway, Tom will sell the final fix kit, still in the unopened box for \$14 or see him if interested, maybe he'll make a deal.

- * Standard Microsoft BASIC, Extended BASIC and Disk BASIC, with a number of very fancy enhancements written by Microware Systems Corp (the OS-9 people) according to RAINBOW.
- A new keyboard, much the same as the new deluxe keyboard now offered (with a CONTROL and ALTERNATE key, two function keys and the cursor keypad in a diamond configuration on the right side of the keyboard).
- # A slightly new color scheme for the case, using the now-familiar cream color and a light gray around the edge of the keyboard.
- # Choice of 32, 40 and 80 column display widths with upper and lowercase and TRUE descenders.
 - * FULLY COMPATIBLE with ALL the software you now own.
- \$ 08-9 Level II operating system for a true multi-tasking, multi-using system.
- * FULLY compatible with HARDWARE you now own. There will be a small problem running OS-9 with older models of the Multi-Fak interface (now being sold for \$79.95). Tandy will make a fix available for about \$6, excluding installation according to RAINBOW.)
- * A new interface for a new analog RGB monitor available from TANDY in order to use the high resolution graphics. The CM-B Monitor is priced at \$299.
 - # The list price of the Color Computer 3 is \$217.

For more information and all the things the CoCo 3 can do read the articles in the Beptember issue of RAINBOW Magazine and I'll have some articles as soon as I can get the CoCo 3 in my hands.

- SPELLER PROGRAM FOR BACK-TO-SCHOOL -

Just in time for the Back-to-School gang, a S-F-E-L-L-E-R program to be used on the CoCo.

The program was originally published in 80-U.S. Journal and was written by Charles Hohn.

This program is designed to "talk" to non-readers. But with a little imagination, it could be used to quiz anyone on definitions, terms, or equations. With the GLDAD command at the end of the program you can link a group of programs on one tape. This will allow you to load the program into the computer, leave the play button down on the cassette recorder and let the child run the program.

Type the program in and insure there are no bugs before saving it on tape and making the audio recordings. Once debugged, you're ready to CSAVE. Use a 60-minute cassette to allow for the linking of a number of programs.

After CSAVEing, leave the play and record buttons DN. At this point, disconnect the EAR and AUX jacks from the tape

recorder. This will leave only the MIC (remote) jack plugged in (It's the small gray one.) The audio recording will be made using the built-in microphone of the recorder.

RUN the program. When the cassette motor comes on, give the instructions (spell 'house'). The motor will stop and the computer waits for input. Press ENTER, and the motor will come on again. This is a second-chance. Repeat the same instructions, or add to it. The motor will stop and the computer waits for input. Press ENTER and the correct spelling and score are displayed. After a few seconds, the routine starts all over with the next word. Repeat this procedure until all words in the DATA lines (5-60) have been recorded on tape.

At the end of the program, the computer asks if you would

like to play again. If you enter "Y" the computer will CLDAD, but there is nothing to CLOAD. So instead, enter "N" and change the words in the DATA lines (50-60). If more than ten words are used, change the value of X in line 70. If you like, you can increase the count in lines 120, 230 and 290. This will give you more time for instructions. Note: The count in line 230 MUST match the count in line 290. This allows the computer to skip over the second-chance audio recording when the first answer is correct.

Once all the changes have been made, CSAVE, RUN, and make the audio recordings as before. Any substitutions can be made to make this program usable for foreign languages, equations, etc.
