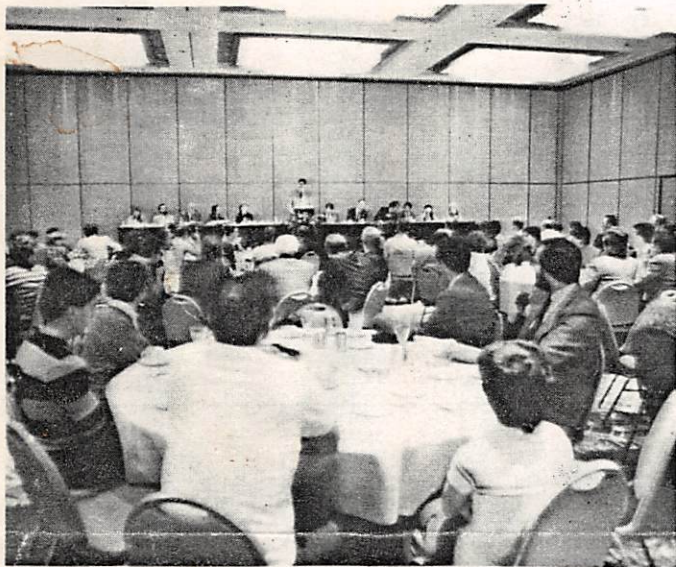

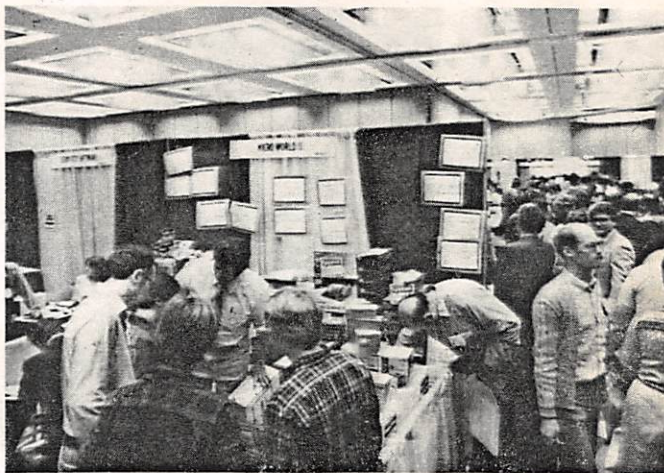

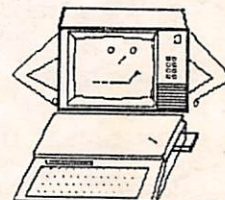

After initially applying to the BBS, your application will be verified within 48 hours and you are on the way to utilize the BBS. The board has been in service in the beginning of August and has a number of users, locally and some nationally.

At present there is no uploading and downloading available until Nevin can get a better BBS software to eliminate lock-ups in the downloading and uploading methods.

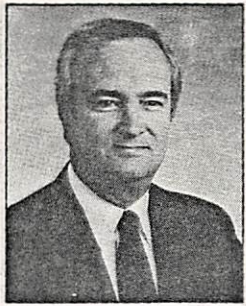

COLOR COMPUTER 3

Enough background, let's get to the new computers. I'm going to include press kits with this newsletter to show you the details, but I'll give you an overview here of what each machine is, and what's so good about it.

Let's talk CoCo... Color Computer 3 is here at last! After 2 or 3 years of rumors, here's a new 6809E-based machine supporting OS-9 Level 2, with selectable speed equal to or double that of the CoCo 2. It comes with 32K ROM, and 128K RAM, expandable to 512K. All this horsepower allows a new window manager called "Multi-Vue". There's also a new version of DeskMate called DeskMate 3 (coming Sept 30) which allows selection of functions by name or icon.

CoCo 3 is capable of 32x16, 40x80x24 text displays, and color graphics from 64x32 8-colors to 640x192 4-colors, with several intermediate formats.

The CoCo 3 incorporates a proprietary chip for memory management. The powerful OS-9 Level 2.0 operating system will have the ability to run business applications, and even perform multi-tasking functions.

Twenty-one new commands have been added to Extended BASIC, yet software and hardware for previous Color Computers will function on this new one (there's a \$6.00 modification required on the Multi-Pak Interface). We can anticipate, of course, some new more powerful CoCo 3 software which won't function on previous models.

CONCLUSION

Demonstration units will be in stores hopefully by the time you read this. All of these products will be available in the month of August. I think you're going to be completely fascinated, especially with the graphics on the CoCo and the 1000's. They're absolutely bringing added value and a whole new dimension to "PC compatibility" that's sure to be cloned by a lot of our competitors in coming months.

COCO - PEEKS, POKES & EXECs

COMMAND: POKE 65495,0
RESULT: High-speed poke---Doubles the speed of arithmetic & data processing from .89mhz to 1.7mhz.
REMARKS: ***DANGER*** This poke makes the computer chips hotter than usual. High speed operations can shorten the life of chips to a year or so. This poke does not work with disk.

COMMAND: POKE 65494,0
RESULT: Returns computer to normal mode after POKE 65495,0
REMARKS: Use this poke before inputting or outputting any information to tape if you are using the high speed poke.

COMMAND: POKE 113,0
RESULT: Produces a cold-start when the reset button is pressed
REMARK: This poke can be set up in a program to produce a cold start.

COMMAND: EXEC 40999
RESULT: Produces a cold start
REMARKS: If you use this command after the above poke the computer will produce an immediate cold-start.

COMMAND: POKE 383,158
RESULT: Disables list command
REMARKS: List command after this poke will produce garbage
RESULT: Re-establishes list command after POKE 383,158
REMARKS: None

COMMAND: EXEC 44539
RESULT: Waits for a keyboard input
REMARKS: Same as 'A\$=INKEY\$:IF A\$="" THEN 10'

COMMAND: EXEC 41175
RESULT: Displays sign-on message and version
REMARKS: Can be used to determine whether you have version 1,0 or 1,1

WHERE O WHERE IS THE COCO 3????

CASSETTE TAPES WITH ERRORS WITH THIS SHORT PROGRAM

If any of your cassette tapes have errors and you want your CoCo to accept the tape program so you don't have to re-type the whole listing, use this short program to eliminate some of the re-typing for you.

If your Basic program will not load, run Program listing 2 and then CLOAD that bad tape. When an I/O error is encountered, the code up to the error can be saved to tape as an ASCII file, by typing CSAVEM"filename".A. After cycling power, the ASCII file can be loaded and edited.


