## CoCo CLIPBOARD MAGAZINE INTRODUCED

The Penn-Jersey Color Computer Club recently received a NEW magazine specifically for the CoCo. "CoCo Clipboard Magazine" just came out with their second issue (it's published every other month) and it appears to look good.

According to an introductory letter from Ted Paul, publisher, he writes "First of all we are geared towards "real world" applications and uses of the Color Computer. We don't cater to lo-res graphics games of space blasters or useless utilities tht convert recipies. We publish articles and programs that will produce something you can use and enjoy. In issue No. 1. OS9 users found a program called HDIR (by Bob can der Poel) for creating and displaying the complex disk directory structure found in OS9. In issue No. 2, CoCo users who tinker with Ham radio found and article on how to set up their CoCo with an RS-232 Pak and access the world of Packet Radio. Our readers who like Basic will also benefit from Bill Bernico's Basic Help column which offers answers and programs to solve their problems."

Paul continues, "Issue No. 3 (January of '88) will have a super CoCo 3 graphic program called "POWERGRAPH" written in BASIC 09 by Randy Krippner, and a geneological program in BASIC for the CoCo 2.

"Clipboard is also the only CoCo magazine to offer manufacturers coupons to it's readers. Our advertisers have made money saving coupons available to every Clipboard reader. Those coupons can be clipped from the magazine without losing any of the articles or programs. In many cases the savings you'll enjoy from the coupons will more than pay for your subscription."

Having looked through the Clipboard Magazine and read some of the articles — it looks like it will be a great addition to the CoCo world. The second issue has columns on Assembly, Pascal, OnLine with CompuServe, Basic Help, Basic O9 and articles on CoCo'N Amateur Radio, CoCo-izing Your Business and The Dream Machine by Tony DeStafano.

### OS-9 AND MULTI-VUE

There has been some confusion regarding the OS-9 development system for the Color Computer 3. Yes, it has been shipped. Yes, unfortunately it is also on backorder. By the time you read this, our second shipment should have been received, and in the warehouses, available.

The demand caught us by surprise. We expected it to be popular, but we didn't anticipate how popular. Add to that some unexpected delays, and our first production run just filled backorders, but didn't leave enough to satisfy current demand. As a result, we've found ourselves on backorder again.

The order due in before November 1, should clear the new backorders and give us stock for immediate availability.

Multi-Vue is waiting for the manual to be printed. We expect it to be available around mid-November.

I saw a demonstration of Multi-Vue today, and it's slick! What's really amazing is to see a \$476 system (Christmas prices for the 128K CoCo 3, disk, OS-9 and Multi-Vue combined) running several concurrent tasks, with a user interface which includes multiple windows, icons, pull-down menus, and pop-up dialogue

boxes. For megabucks, you could have a "loaded" AT and Xenix, yes... but for \$476 !!!

Our product manager tells me OS-9 allocates memory in 64K chunks, so the practical limit to concurrent tasks in a 512K system is eight. However, in normal use most folks probably won't exceed three or four.

We're truly sorry for the delays. Thanks very much for your patience. You won't be disappointed!
