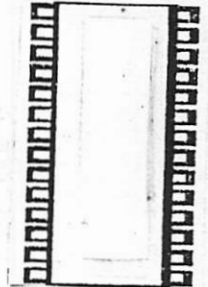
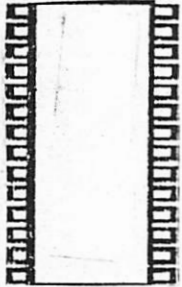

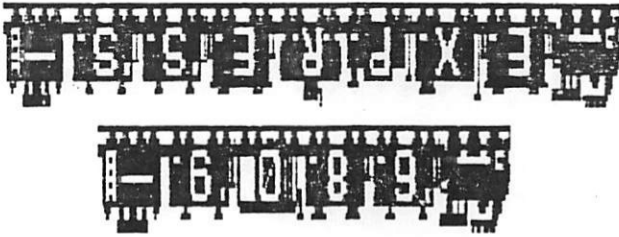
Under random access, Richard Kravits brought in a Packard-Bell computer to demonstrate how a new modem is installed into a PC.
