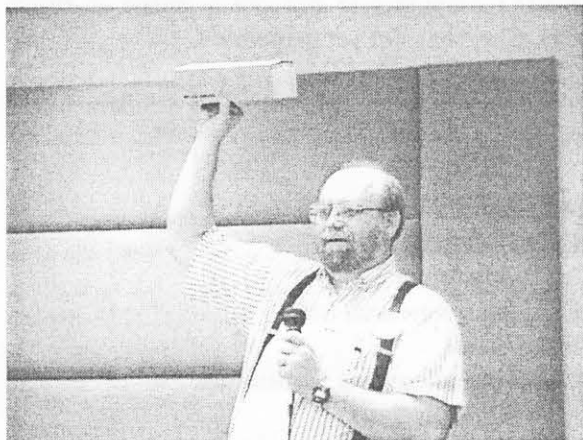
I was unable to see all the kinds of items and how much of these items were sold by our vendors as I had to stand by my own table. I was able to sell a few items myself.

Frank and Carol Davis of FWD computing once again provided our shirts and mouse pads as well as many-many CDs.



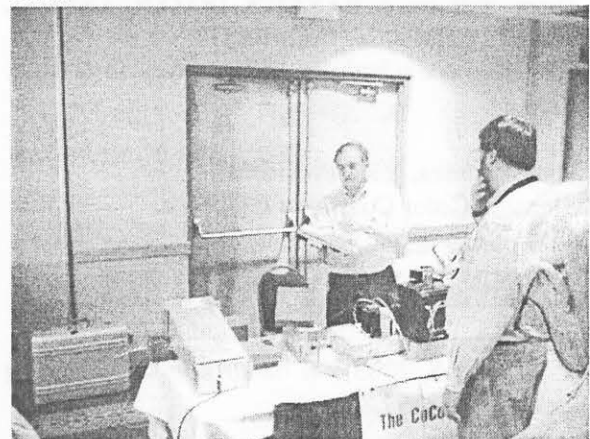
To me one of the most successful activities at our Fests is the no minimum bid auction.



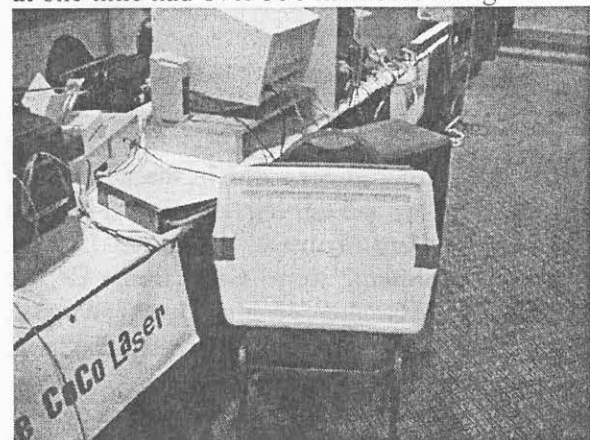
Again this year we were able to sell a lot of CoCo and other good stuff.

The Cup of CoCo BBS needs your vote!

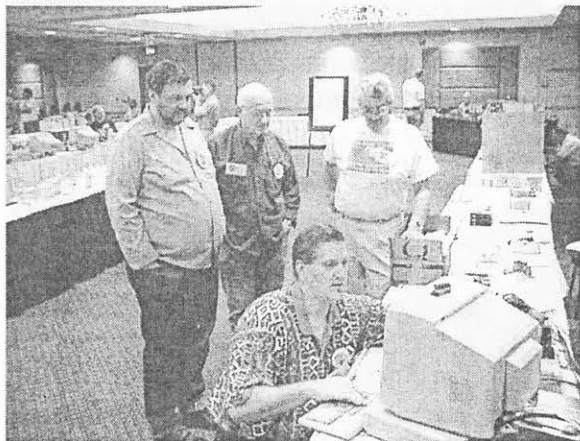

With the advent and the proliferation of Web-based archives and services, is there still a need in the community for dial-up computer Bulletin Boards? These information resources and leisure time kleptomaniacs once spanned the globe with intercommunication networks like FIDONET. Almost any, now classic, computer could be configured to run a Bulletin Board System, although, with many of those early computers, that's all that could be done; one user, one program, period. The Color Computer operating in the Disk Extended Color Basic mode was one of these. There were many DECB BBSs to be picked from, each with their own areas of specialty. There were message bases, file storage areas, gaming sections and combinations of the three and many other options that were added. ANSI color codes were added to enhance the caller's screen. There was even a system that could accept a caller's mouse-driven screen positioning. All in all, not too shabby for our Little Wonder.

And then came OS9 and a new batch of BBS programs, but with the much-desired capability to run the BBS AND still be able to use the computer for other things while the BBS was in operation. Personally, I have written many articles for The CoCo~123 in years past while a caller was online and accessing the BBS for messages, file transfers or gaming. I, typically, would have the Cup of CoCo BBS running in "Window 7" with windows 5 & 6 dedicated to BBS maintenance of some sort or another. Regular computer usage took place in Term,

W1, W2 and W3. A bit taxing for the memory resources, you might think, and I would agree. But I had installed Disto's 1 Meg upgrade early on and then the 2 Meg memory board. An average of 1 Meg of memory had been set aside as a RAM disk for the BBS Menus and commands directory, after the 2 meg upgrade. Running OS9 at the CoCo's original speed (in spite of the fact that the 68B09E has been replaced with a 6309), the time necessary from boot-up to RAM disk load to BBS execution ended up taking no longer than 3 minutes and 30 seconds. This includes the formatting of the RAM drive and loading 1 meg of data from the hard drive to the RAM drive, again, not too shabby.

Anyway, the system, after 10 years of running practically 24/7/52, decided that it wanted a rest...just before the 12th Annual "Last" CoCoFEST! The HD that I had been running, and the floppy drive EPROM, it turns out, went south. The red because only the controller board went bad...the media was untouched. Since I had lost an identical HD (ironically, just before the 11th Annual "Last" CoCoFEST!) due to a head crash but kept the unit, I was able to swap the boards and get the system back online. I have since installed another identical HD (MAXTOR LS340SYs are getting hard to find) and am doing "ghosting", as I call it. I back up the first HD to the second on a regular basis (can YOU say backup?) thanks to the Disto 4-in-1 and SCSISYS2.2.



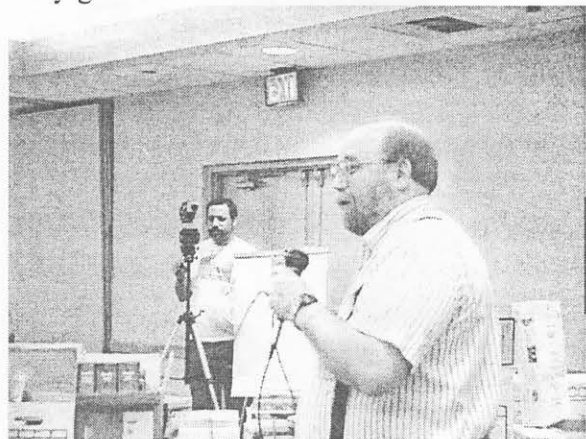
ALSO, a HUGE thank you is due to **Mark Marlette**, who took the time at this year's 'FEST to check out the hard drives for me.

The upshot of the hardware story is this. **The Cup of CoCo could go back online @ 847-428-0436. The choice is yours.** With only an average of 3 calls a month logged over the last 4 months of actual operation, I am undecided as to whether I should take the time (menu and files maintenance) and resources (the extra phone line runs about \$20-\$25 a month plus whatever power the system uses) to operate a system that will be used but by a very few people. So, again, I repeat, **is there still a need in the community for dial-up computer Bulletin Boards?** You can send your answers to the CoCo-123 address that appears on the cover, or to coco-123@juno.com

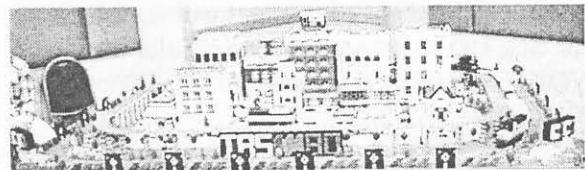


Scott Montgomery was our head security officer this year. The place looks so neat and clean while fest attendees are out to dinner that President Howard notices that he has dirty glasses.
