




sheltered picnic table that can seat 8 to 12 people around comfortably. The result is plenty of great tasting goodies in reach of everybody. Leave your diets at home!






This year Carl Boll brought the neatest tiny picture printer that provided some of the pictures for this article from his laptop computer.
