Rich Bair here with a summary of the last three monthly membership meetings:

Our July meeting was devoted to discussion of various ideas for improving next year's fest. Because we are moving to a different venue some changes are possible which were not possible previously, but the reverse is also true. We may have space for a quick-registration line for people who preregister and prepay, but on the

other hand we may not be able to accept payment for the dinner at the registration point. In other words, it may be a requirement that you prepay for the dinner if you wish to partake.

The Chris Hawks' family has moved out of state to Tennessee and Tony Podraza is also planning such a move. Since they are two who have signing authority on our checking account, we decided to give that authority to two of our local members.

The August meeting focused on details of our relationship with the new venue (the Holiday Inn of Elk Grove Village, or HIEGV), and ideas for the theme for next year's FEST. We also set a date and location for our annual picnic: September 21st (sandwiched between VCFMW on the 14th and Tandy Assembly on the 28th) at Brian Schubring's home, same as last year.

At the September meeting it was announced that our original "official" web page, now nicknamed the "Splash" page because of its colors, and designed and updated by Bob Swoger, has been rescued and now lives at:

The change of venue for next year has brought up several thorny questions regarding our traditional Saturday dinner. The Holiday Inn offers catering service, but their "list" prices for some of the plated dinner choices are nearly three times the \$20 we charged last year. Buffet style is an option; "list" price for it is \$48. We might be able to have the caterer we used last year come in, but HIEGV may not allow that since they have their own in-house system. The club is considering subsidizing the dinner; the Holiday Inn hints that a rebate of some of the dinner expense is likely. Many decisions need to be made; nothing is final yet. We have appointed a dinner committee to hash some of this out. But feel free to direct your comments to any of us; we will listen.



The Tandy/Radio Shack line of computers was well represented at the Midwest Vintage Computer Festival 14 (henceforth just VCF). There was a strong presence of the Color Computer Community. Among those present were Steve Strowbridge, live streaming parts of the show, Tony Podraza, John Mark Mobley, Henry Reitveld, David Ladd, Richard Lorbieski, Grant Leighty, Thomas Czaplinski, Jim Brain plus his daughter Belle, Eric Canales, Jason Reighard, Neil Blanchard, Brian Goers, Evan Wright, Brian "The Music Man" Schubring, Tim Franklin, and yours truly, Salvador Garcia. On Friday, a few of the CoCo community ventured out into the wilds of the Chicago 'burbs in search of the elusive Fire & Wine pizzeria. After some cunning navigation led by a GPS, the group zeroed in on the target and proceed to wait about 30 minutes before they finally let us in.

This badge has been sold at other VCF shows, including those abroad. One of the shows sold roughly 500 of these ingenious 6502 computers! I wouldn't be surprised if the total number of badges sold reached or surpassed 1,000 units.






