As you may or may not know, the CSAVEM and SAVEM commands are used to make back-ups of machine language programs. The CSAVEM command saves the program to cassette tape and has the following format: CSAVEM "Filename", start, end, transfer - where the Filename is the name of the ornoram. Start is the beginning address where it resides. End is the ending address where it ends, and Transfer is the address where it should be executed. The SAVEM command has the same format as CSAVEN but SAVEN saves the program to disk instead of cassette. Obviously, in order to use the CSAVEM and SAVEM commands, you need to find the Start, End, and Transfer numbers. We found that the following formulas can sometimes work.

Start - PEFK(ART)\*256 + PEFK(ARR) End = PEEK(126)\*256 + PEEK(127)-1 Transfer = PFFK(157)\*256 + PFFK(158)

These formulas do not always work. This is probably because the Basic interpretor alters the above memory locations before you can get to them,
