DISK USERS: Insert disk and run DIR. CASSETTE TAPES USERS: Rewind tape. Zero the tape counter. Fast Forward to desired program's tape counter number and enter CLOAD or CLOADM. If while loading or running a program you get a FC, DM, or SW error, you probably have to enter the PMODE and PCLEAR values from the keyboard. We try to put as many duplicates of the programs on tape as possible. If the first copy does not load, try the second copy, or if it has one, the third. If you cannot get the tape or disk to load the programs properly, then send it back for a prompt replacement.

1. MARKET WATCHER - This home management program lets you easily analyze several stock market financial indicators. You can keep an eye on the Dow Jones, NYSE volume, the American Exchange, and the Over-The-Counter (NASDAQ) stock exchange. As you build your file of values, you can save and load with both tape and disk. You can also generate a graph of the values for analysis. Disk users: We have a last minute fix. Line 865 should read: 865 OPEN"I",#DN,P\$:INPUT #DN,NE

2. 3 STOOGES - This is an informational program about the famous comedy team "The Three Stooges". Learn about their origins and the many cast changes that took place over the years. Also provided is a complete list of the films they made.

3. HOSTAGE - In this text adventure game, you rescue the hostage to solve the adventure. You start out in a research lab. You can use verbs like kick, move, get, take, drop, leave, look, examine, etc. Also, use N., S., E., and W. for direction.

4. PROGRAM TRIO - This is a collection of three programs all rolled up into one. The first program, Change Maker, does just that. You enter in an amount between 1 cent and 99 cents and the computer draws and prints the correct coins needed to make the change. In the second program, Roman Numerals, you enter in a number and the correct Roman Numerals are displayed. In the third program, Decimal-Fraction Converter, you enter in a fraction and a decimal appears. Also, you enter a decimal and the correct fraction appears.

5. GLADIATOR - In this game, you are trapped in a gladiator pit with a monster that breathes poison. You have a sword to fight with, but you must be close and in line with the monster to successfully attack. It takes 15 hits to kill the monster. If you come in contact with poison gas, you will lose an amount of life energy. You can control the gladiator's movement with the arrow keys. Use the sword by pressing the space-bar.

6. US & CANADA QUIZ - This is a graphic US/CANADA states and capital quiz program for the color computer 3. A map of the United States and Canada is drawn. Then a state, providence, or territory is filled in. You must guess the state, providence or territory. If you can't guess it then press for the correct answer. Then you must correctly guess the capital. In the quiz mode your score is posted.

7. JEOPARDY - Two players using joysticks can play against each other. Player 1 will use the left joystick and player 2 will use the right joystick. The game works like this. One player has control of the board. He/she is allowed to pick a square in any of the 5 categories. The answer for that square will appear on the screen. At this point, both players have the opportunity to ring-in and give the correct question. Note: Do not answer with 'who is' or 'what is'. Push the fire button on your joystick to ring-in. If no one rings in for the answer, the computer will automatically give you the correct answer. Once you've rung in, you will be asked to give the question. If you give the correct question, then you earn 100, 200, 300, 400, or 500 dollars in normal jeopardy and 200, 400, 600, 800, or 1000 in double jeopardy. If you give an incorrect answer, then you lose the amount. Whoever gets the question right has control of the board. Unlike the real jeopardy there are no audio jeopardy's or final Jeopardy's. There are 3 game files for 3 different games which can be automatically loaded and run. There is also a program called GAMESMAKER. This program will allow you to make more game files to be used with the Jeopardy program.

8. ELECTRONICS 15 - Learn more about radio waves and radio theory in part 15 of our series on electronics. This program requires 32K and a second module called E15MOD. When you run the tape version of this program, leave the play button depressed so it will automatically load the module. To save the module, enter (C)SAVEM "E15MOD", 26000, 32632, 30000.

9. COLOR COMPUTER 3 SCREEN PRINT - This machine language utility program will copy 40-column (WIDTH40) and 80-column (WIDTH80) coco 3 screens onto the printer. To use: LOADM or CLOADM the routine and simply enter EXEC when you need it. Be sure the printer is ready and filled with paper before EXECing this routine. To save this program, enter (C)SAVEM "CC3PRINT", 32000,32147,32000.

10. CITY - CITY is a machine language utility program that gives Color computer users the same power as the 'CITY' command in an IBM PC compatible. CITY transfers complete computer control to the serial port (instead of the screen and keyboard). If you have a terminal, another computer, or a modem connected to your serial port, then you can have "remote control" of your color computer. To use: LOADM or CLOADM the utility and EXEC when you are ready to transfer control to the serial port. Normally when you run a program, the computer expects input from the keyboard. CITY changes the normal setting so the computer expects input from the serial port. To save this machine language utility, enter (C)SAVEM"CITY", 16000,16199,16000.

This month we have an additional program called 'CHOPPER'. Simply type CLOAD 'CHOPPER' or RUN 'CHOPPER' if you have a disk system. Use the up and down arrows to maneuver your chopper and the space bar to fire.
