DISK USERS: Insert disk and run DIR. CASSETTE TAPE USERS: Rewind tape. Zero the tape counter. Press Forward to desired program's tape counter number and enter 'CLOAD' or 'CLOADM'.

If while loading or running a program, you get a FC, DM, or SM error, you probably have to enter the PMODE and PCLEAR values from the keyboard. We try to put as many duplicates of the programs (on tape as possible, if the first copy does not load, try the second copy, or if it has one, the third. If you cannot get the tape or disk to load the programs properly, then send it back for a prompt replacement.

Welcome to our 87th issue of subscription software. We have two fixes for last month's program "PHONE". In line 150 it reads PD=0 when it should read PD=-2. In line 400 it reads PD=0:T=0. It should read PD=-2:T=0. We hope that this did not cause too much confusion.

1. PURCHASE ORDER - This business program allows you to manipulate and maintain 2 databases: one for vendors, one for your purchase orders. Vendor information stored includes name, address, and phone number. Up to 100 vendors may be entered into one file on a 32K system. The purchase order database lets you enter in date, description, vendor #, amount, purchase type (either CASH or ON-ACCOUNT), and whether the order has been received or not. Up to 350 PO's may be put into one file on a 32K system. The data created may be imported into the General Journal/General Ledger program which will appear next month. The first thing you do when running this program is to select 'V' for Vendor menu. Next, add all the vendors (companies which you will be purchasing a product from). Once you have done this you can easily create/print purchase orders. You can also personalize your program in lines 27-29 by inserting your name and address and then re-saving the program. This program has an additional data file called PO-COUNF.DAT.

2. INVENTORY INVOICE - This business program works with three databases: Customer data, Inventory data, and Sales invoice data. The customer data can be displayed, printed and also, mailing labels can be printed. Inventory data stored includes part #, description, wholesale cost, retail price, and quantity. Up to 50 different parts may be entered into a 32K machine. When sales invoices are entered, the operator need only specify customer, and part #'s and quantities of each item ordered. The computer will total up the invoice and add applicable sales tax. You can have

up to 100 customers, 50 different parts and up to 7 invoices stored in a 32K machine. The first thing you should do when running this program is to run 'I' and add all the inventory. Next, you should add to your customers list all the customers. When a customer makes a purchase you can create an invoice for him and your inventory will be automatically reduced. This program has an additional data file called IV-COUNT.DAT.

3. AMERICAN TRIVIA - This trivia game is based upon the United States and its presidents. There are 12 rounds in a game. Answering three correct questions in a row will bring you to a bonus screen. There you may earn extra points by correctly answering the capitol cities of various states and their state flowers. This game has a database of over 150 questions and can be played with 1-4 players.

4. KROACH ADVENTURE - In this 2nd part of the Kroach adventure you find yourself in a huge dungeon with people chained to the wall. The main commands include L-Left, R-Right, B-Back, F-Forward, U-Up, D-Down, N-No, Y-Yes, and P-Pistol. Also included are Examine, get, go, look, open, read, search, use, break, grab, hit, jump, kick, push, smack, and speak to. Good luck!

5. TETRA - Tetra is a version of the popular Tetris program offered by Tandy. 7 different shapes will appear at the top of the screen. You can rotate these shapes using the left/right arrow keys. You get bonus points for each layer you fill across. There is an instructional program preceding the main program called TETRINSTR which contains additional instructions.

6. SOLO POKER - This addicting game involves placing 25 cards one at a time on your 5 by 5 grid. You must try to get the best ten poker hands. (5 down, 5 across) Scoring goes as follows: Royal flush - 40, straight flush - 30, four of a kind - 16, full house - 10, flush - 4, straight - 12, 3 of a kind - 6, two pairs - 3, 1 pair - 1. An average score is 50. You need 60 to win.

7. GALAXY 03 - The mini galaxy is infested with planets, star bases, weapon dealers, moons, suns, and more. Use your right joystick to maneuver your spaceship in this Cocom3 only machine language game. You may touch planets, bases, moons and weapon dealers. Since this program is in machine language, you must enter LOADM"GALAXYQ3" or CLOADM (if using tape) to load. Enter EXEC instead of RUN. To save this program, enter (C)SAVEM "GALAXYQ3",4096,27400,4096.

8. IBM PICTURE VIEWER - There are tons of digitized and scanned computer pictures out there on bulletin board systems and on public domain disks. These pictures come in many different pre-defined graphic formats. One of these formats is called IBM BLOAD format. With this utility you will be able to view the pictures and save them as normal PMODE4 Cocom3 pictures. When you run this program, it will read the disk directory, searching for files with an "/IBM" extension. (make sure the BLOAD files you get are saved with an /IBM extension). Once the picture is loaded, you can use your joystick to move around. Pressing the 'S' key will save the current screen frame on disk. This program is a disk only program.

9. RGB ANALOG PATCH 3 - If you are using an RGB analog monitor with your Cocom3, you've noticed by now that some of the best games and programs do not seem to run in color. With this utility we were able to get 80% of all programs to work without any need to edit the original program. We found that an additional 10% could be made compatible with only minor modifications. To run: Turn the computer off and on. Load and run RGB-A-FIX. A machine language file called RGBAFIX.BIN will be automatically loaded and executed. Lastly, run your program as usual. This program will allow Cocom3 users to get color from the next program. To save the ML part, enter (C)SAVEM "RGBAFIX",32700,32767,32700.

10. KING TUT - Here is another Tom Mix favorite. Journey through the caverns of King Tut's tomb. You are on a quest to find treasures hidden in the caverns below. You light your way with only a small candle that grows dimmer as time passes. Watch out for the snakes and the ghost of King Tut himself. Five screens challenge your abilities every step of the way. You get an extra life for each 20,000 points. The screen goes darker when time reaches 1000. The screen goes completely black when time reaches 0. You are not dead but you have to go back to the surface and relight the candle. Since this program is written in ML, you must enter LOADM"TUT" or CLOADM"TUT" to load. Enter EXEC to run. To save this program, enter (C)SAVEM"TUT",7168,16080,7168.
