


Editorial

Welcome to the first issue of *UpTime*! Before I go on with all the hype and bustle, I would like to take a little time to tell you how *UpTime* came about.

The CoCo market has seen many highs and lows since the CoCo's introduction over ten years ago. Interest in the "new color machine" grew as people realized that this new machine was good for simple programming as well as the games for which it was marketed. It became so popular as a neat programming tool that Tandy released the CoCo 2 as a smaller brother with expanded memory. If it weren't for the unanticipated welcome with which these models were greeted, the CoCo 3 would never have seen the light of day, much less the thousands of people who invested their money and effort into working with this new machine. The CoCo3 went far beyond the first models with greatly enhanced speed, memory, and graphics.

Unfortunately, interest in the CoCo has fallen over the past year. Most of the problem is in communications-mostCoCoowners do not have access to information





about the distributor's products and services. An advertisement can only convey so much information about a piece of software, but live reviews and comparisons can give not only information but a*feel* for the product.

Another problem for distributors is the lack of a good, inexpensive way of getting their information to *you*, the customers. Many great programs are written by "at home" programmers who cannot advertise because of Rainbow'shigh advertising rates. Many other manufacturers have dropped their ads for the same reason.

In fact, that is the primary motivation behind *UpTime*- get as much information to the customers as we possibly can. The advertising and subscription rates have been set to just cover printing and mailing expenses.

What can you expect to find in Uptime?The latest information about new software products and services and even what may be coming out a few months down the road, CoCo/ 68xxx shows and festivals, reviews, information about software upgrades and compatibility, and much more!

AND TOWARDS THE FUTURE...

The computer industry has gone though a remarkable change since the first personal computers came out in the late seventies. But one of the constant variables, until now, has been the basic operating system design. A computer's operating system is the basic code that controls the allocation of resources and devices for the userlevel applications. For example, both RS-DOS and OS9 are operating systems for the CoCo, OSK for 68xxx based machines, MS-DOS, OS/2, and now more recently Windows for IBM compatibles, and the "nameless" Apple Macintosh operating system. Another popular

operating system is UNIX and is used mostly on high end work stations, although there are scaled down versions for IBMs and Apples.

All of the "first generation" operating systems only let one program operate at a time. Before another program could start, the first program must first close down and return to a point where another program could be started. MS-DOS, RS-DOS, and the Macintosh operating systems






all fell into this category. Even with this limitation, MS-DOS provided TSR (Terminate and Stay Resident) facilities, Macintosh provided desktop accessories, and RS-DOS has custom programmed "desk accessory" possibilities. These options allowed a small, universally useful utility, such as a calculator or date book, to be called up while a program was running. Although this did not actually run both programs at the same time, it allowed you to switch between the programs without closing down the main application. Although this was a neat trick, these utilities were usually hard to program and in some cases the application itself would have to provide external handling routines in order for the accessories to work.

The next step in most operating systems was what became known as "cooperative multitasking". First, multitasking means that more than one program can use the CPU at the same time. The difference lies in how the switching takes place. In a cooperative multitasking environment, the operating system switches program control when operating system level operations are called, such as reading to a device or updating a screen. The only problem with this technique is that a program could tie up the computer, such as during a large spreadsheet recalculation. The only way out of this is for the programmer to make "dummy" system calls several times during the calculation that are only used for the purpose of allowing a switch to take

place. This process does allow other programs to process information in the background, such as a terminal program that is downloading a large amount of information. Although this technique is used in Windows and the Macintosh under MultiFinder or System 7.x, it still requires the programmer to make a conscious effort to make the system happy.

The other class of operating systems is called "preemptive multitasking" operating systems. Both OS9 and OSK fall under this category, as well as UNIX and OS/2. Next month we will take a closer look at how these operating systems work and some of the advantages when programming under such a system.


