### Editorial



# AND TOWARDS THE FUTURE...

Last month we had a discussion about the different operating systems in the computers that you see around you today.

First, recall that an operating system is the basic code that controls the allocation of resources and devices for the user-level applications. As we looked at the different systems that have come about, we saw that the first operating systems were not very efficient and were designed to only work on one thing at a time.

Then more complex systems allowed you to switch between the main application and one or more "desk accessories" as they are known in Apple-land, or TSRs in IBM lingo. Then came the realization of the dream of switching between different applications on the fly.

Up to this point, it is still only a switch between the actual programs, and any apparent multitasking (the ability to have different programs executing or doing work at the same time) was handled "cooperatively" between the different applications as each voluntarily gave up control in case any other applications needed it. Of course, if an application were to do an intensive cycle and did not relinquish control periodically, the computer would "freeze" until the operation terminated, and the user could not switch to another application. This in essence defeats the goal of multi-tasking: to work on other projects as the computer chugs along with a large calculation.

"Preemptive multitasking" is the answer to the problems in the last example. A preemptive multitasking environment frees the program from worrying about relinquishing control.

Instead, the operating system periodically interrupts, or preempts, the currently running program, or process, and switches to any other that need CPU time. In this way, the operating system distributes the CPU's time between many different programs, and preempts them whenever their time period elapses, rather than when the program decides it is time for a switch.

added The benefit programmers is the fact that programs are much easier to write when you do not have to worry about relinquishing control in just about every part of the program. The other benefit from the user's perspective is that it is extremely easy to kill, or terminate a process by simply refusing to give it any more time and returning the program's resources (such as open files and memory) to the system. In addition, this form of operating system more effectively handles interrupts, because the operating system preempts the current process whenever an interrupt is received, thus the interrupt can be serviced more quickly than if the operating system had to wait for the CPU to become available.

OS-9 is a fully preemptive based operating system, and it has been available for the CoCo since the early 1980's. UNIX is a very popular operating system that is also preemptive based; it is used almost exclusively on workstations and is also available on IBMs (XENIX) and Apples (A/UX).

Although UNIX was originally written at AT&T laboratories, the University of Berkeley totally rewrote the system to eliminate AT&T's hold on royalties, thus popularizing the software even more. Although a few different versions of UNIX exist, they all are essentially the same.

OS-9 and UNIX are very

similar, and moving between the two is quite easy once you are familiar with the idea of background processes (other programs running that you are not currently working with) and file paths (the flow of information between programs and files on permanent media).

Another interesting sidenote about UNIX is the fact that it is written almost entirely in C. C is a lower-level language, but it is still interesting that a popular operating system is not written in direct assembly language but rather a compiled language. The main benefit from this is the ease of portability of the operating system to different platforms. There is a slight speed penalty, but the code has been thoroughly optimized and does the job of running the computer quite well.

Another contender in the race for popular preemptive based systems is Windows NT by Microsoft. Originally, Microsoft wrote Windows to give IBM compatibles a graphical based "Macintosh" feel. In this new release, the system will provide full multitasking abilities to the IBMs, as well as a few other platforms that Microsoft is targeting.

Sofar Apple has not announced anything similar for their Macintosh line, although the possibility of yet another system upgrade for the Macintosh cannot be ruled out.

Another new concept that is


beginning to surface is the idea of multithreaded operating system. opposed multitasking. In the multitasking environment, each program is a process, and manyindividual

processes can execute at the same time. In a multithreaded operating system, each program is actually a series of threads, or parts of the program that are running at the same time. Instead of many processes executing at the same time, there are many threads executing at the same time.

Each program can be broken down into many different subprograms, such as character input, printing driver, file transfer, etc. Each thread communicates with the others via messages implemented by the operating system. For instance, the input thread could send the main thread a message that a 'print' button has been pushed. The main thread might send an auto-save message to the file transfer thread and then a print command to the print thread. After the print command is sent, the main thread has the option of going ahead with other tasks while the print thread processes the document at the same time. We might take a closer look at this concept in a future issue.

I hope this provides you with a little background into the inner workings of the computers that you use in your everyday lives. Next time, I would like to take a closer look at how OS-9 itself works and compare it to some of the newer systems that are starting to surface.

and whether or not the program is still being sold; if the program is still being sold, the current price and contact address would also be included.

As more information comes in and changes occur, we would update the database accordingly. Although we plan to publish this information in *UpTime*, a full listing would probably take up more pages than any single issue has. What will probably occur is a partial listing of the database each month, probably limited to changes and/or special features (such as word processors only). What we need is the support of everyone to make this work—we are going to contact every dealer that we know of for a list of their products, and we need to know of any information that you might have about longforgotten programs and where they can currently be found.

I hope this project comes together, but again, it hinges on the support of everyone out there. Look here for an update of this project in the upcoming months.
