The Tandy Hi-Res Interface with RS-DOS

Since the article about the Hi-Res Interface code last month, I have decoded the OS-9 Level II routine. Microware did not use the timer interrupt but "cheated" by not keeping a constant number of cycles per count loop. This allowed a loop of 9 clock cycles for counts from 1 to 255 with more code added after the 255th count.

This would result in periodic glitches if the routine was used in a project like William Barden's CoCo oscilloscope for example. However, it is fine for reading joystick movements and the savings in clock cycles obviates the need for IRQ processing.

CoCo Graphics

Well, I hope you have figured out how the *cos* and *sin* functions are used to produce circles, arches, and ellipses. In this issue, I will explain how to draw specific angles using the *cos* and *sin* functions. This article assumes you are using a PMODE screen. You could adapt this program to work on the SET/RESET screen if you needed to, but you would also need to use the SET/RESET screen line drawing program I presented in my first article.

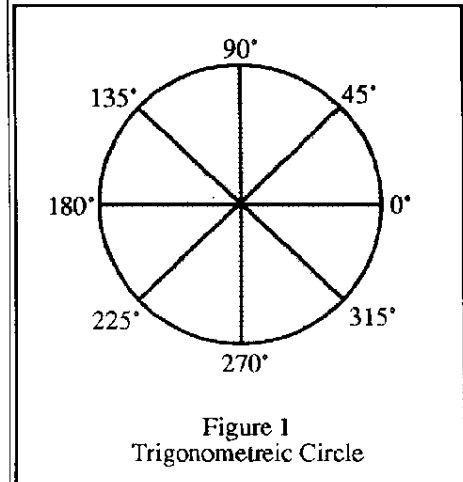
Drawing angles is complicated to explain, but is relatively easy to do. If you recall from my last article, we used *cos* and *sin* to find points on a circle. To draw an angle, all we

have to do is find the degrees that we want on the circle and draw two rays from the center of the circle to the two points to form the angle.

Let's say we wanted to draw a 90° angle. First decide where the angle is going to be placed on the screen in terms of the *x* and *y* coordinates. Note that the *x* and *y* coordinates will be the vertex (center point) of the angle, and *cos* and *sin* are trigonometric functions so we will be using trigonometric measurements. Not only could we use the 0° and 90° measurements to get a 90° angle, but we could also use 180° and 270°, or 90° and 180°, or 135° and 225°, etc. Notice that if you subtract the smallest degree from the largest we always get 90°. The only time that this does not work is when

the 0° is included within the angle. If you look at Figure 1, you will notice that using 315° and 45° will give us a 90° angle but 315 minus 45 does not equal 90. Since the 0° is included in the angle, we must do the check in a

different way. First subtract the larger measure from 360. In this case it will be 360 minus 315, which is 45. Now we add the smaller measure to the result to get 90° (45+45).

When you have finished deciding what degrees you are going to use, make the smaller value D1 and the larger value D2. Then substitute all of the information into the following subroutine:

Before calling the routine, make sure you assign a value to D1, D2, X, Y, and L as explained in the REM lines of the routine. Then, when you need an angle to be drawn, use a GOSUB 1000 to call the routine.

The routine works almost the same way it did in my last article, only it finds two specific point on the circle instead of all of the points on the circle. Notice that the length of the lines drawn (variable L) is actually the radius of the circle. The larger the

circle, the longer the lines in the angle will be.

Well, that is it for this issue. Next time I will explain how to do two and three dimensional rotations using the cos and sin functions and some fancy animation techniques.

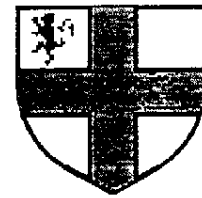

Disk Fix

Disk Fix is a simple utility program that will attempt to fix a disk that has I/O errors during the formatting process. To use the program, first try to reformat the disk that has an error on it. If it formats correctly, then you are all set. If an error occurs during the format, then load Disk Fix and type RUN. The computer will prompt you to insert the disk to be fixed. Insert the disk and press any key to start. The computer will then search through the disk keeping a record of all the locations that are bad. Then the FAT table will be updated so that the computer thinks the bad sectors are being used by a program; therefore, no attempt will be made to save data on the bad sectors of the disk. Note that this should be run *before* any files are placed on the disk.

Some things you should be aware of: a disk cannot be salvaged if the directory track is damaged, the program can not fix disks if they are formatted for 40 tracks or higher, and the *backup* command can not be used to copy the disk even after Disk Fix is used. If you want to copy the disk, you must use the copy command or a utility program that bypasses disk errors during copying.

routine, the least I can do is leave his name there as author for others, who may enjoy the program as well, to see. It is just a small thank you and having respect for your fellow man.

Can you ethically alter 'Public Domain' programs? About the only thing other authors and myself do expect is a little credit where credit is due. For example, two different CoCo groups chose to use one of my graphics for their club logos. That someone considered my work that worthwhile made me feel honored—except I really was not. One promptly removed my name from the graphic with never a mention of where it came from. The other went a step further. They made a couple of minor

changes and placed someone else's name as the graphic author! I will be a little nicer and not mention their names. Besides, we at MI&CC had, the key word here is *had*, a user who put together a disk each month for our group. I began noticing there was no indication of who the authors were or where the programs were coming from. What is more, I began seeing *his name* on programs that he could not have written, just because he re-wrote some of the PRINT statements or renumbered some lines. What the heck, he was just a kid, and anyone with teenager knows they can sometimes be a little selfish and immature. We did ask him nicely to stop.

But can you change a program? Why not? Speaking

personally, of the many graphics and programs I placed into public domain, I give them out for the CoCo supporter's pleasure. And I fully expect them to be modified by anyone who can add or use them more to their benefit. I have modified quite a few myself. If the modification is significant, I will add under the author's names: *modified by — and the date*. Occasionally I have sent the updated version to the original author, and received nothing so far except positive comments.
