
You see, this is how creative genius is stamped out, and why many micro computers, like the TI-99/4A, have become obsolete.


First, the inexpensive software sources, such as the software authors offering ShareWare items, give up because of minimal or no support, the user base dries up, and the logical next step is obsolescence.







Here are REVIEWS of some of the 'NEWEST' programs and games. These will be wrote by different readers of the magazine each month. If you want to do a review go ahead and write it and send it in. Review of Spectrum Project's TW-80 patch.

As you very well know, Telewriter 64 has become the "Word Processor" standard by which all others are judged. When the CoCo 3 came along I was aware there were some software incompatibilities with some software packages, but I wasn't sure which ones worked and which didn't. I tried a few games, a few utilities, a few graphic programs & my favorite word processor. I was shocked when Telewriter 64 didn't work! What was I to do? I couldn't use VIP Writer (I hated it). So I called some "CoCo friends" to see if they had any suggestions and one said to call a BBS in Canada and download a patch he saw while on this BBS.

I called & downloaded it. With great anticipation I logged off & went to basic to patch TW64 and revive an old friend... Well, the patch did not work. At this point I started looking through The RAINBOW trying to find a commercial patch program. I found a few, but I decided to go with "TW-80".

The patch was \$39.95 plus s/h. I called the long distance num. expecting to place the order COD, as I usually do, but got a recording saying "for your convenience, send a check or money-order" and that they were not taking phone or COD orders anymore. This wasn't what I wanted to hear, and on top of that paying for a long distance call. So I got a money-order, (additional expense), and sent it off and six days later I finally got the patch!

After reading the manual I did as it instructed, got my original Telewriter 64 disk and a blank formatted disk to put the new version on. I first did a directory of the TW-80 disk and found that it already had the original TW64 files on it and I didn't need my old disk.

Next, I ran "patcher" and a few seconds later it was done. The manual then said to run the configure program and setup the program with my defaults like number of drives, default data drive, printer baud rate, characters per line, screen fore/background colors etc...

Now we were at the moment of truth, RUN "BOOT"... It worked! There was the main menu on an 80 column screen! What a relief!

The program offers many new features as well as the good ol' TW64 functions I was used to. In addition to the standard features of TW64, it has easy access to disk files with on-screen file names that are selected using the arrow keys. The disk I/O menu gives you the handy option of formating a disk so when you run out of space you don't have to hunt down free grans! One thing I don't like with the disk functions is

that it only recognizes the 35 track/68 gran format, and single sided drives, and considering I use 40 track/78 gran format, and double sided drives, I had to find out the hard way when TW-80 erased the last part of one of my disks. Another interesting feature TW-80 has is two ram drives available to 512K users which let you store many files in ram for fast access as well as the ability to exit the program and when you return your files are still there. The files stay resident in ram if you do NOT use a program that uses the extra ram.

The editor works very much the same as TW64 did but, of course, you get 80  $\times$  24 column screen and a buffer of 45K. TW-80 uses the last 8 scan lines of the CoCo 3's screen for a, status line of cursor location, insert/overstrike mode, wordwrap, current file, and free buffer space. If you have the Hi-Res font modifier you can create your font sets to use with TW-80. From the editor you have many control keys that enable you to toggle key-click, end-of-line markers, text alignment and others "Global Search and Replace" One major fault I've found is that the locked up with this version (V1.0).

After typing in your document you would go to the format menu to print the text. You have the standard margins, spacing, page numbering, and printer type options. With TW64 you would hit "P" the dump the file to the printer and if you were lucky enough to have a buffer on your printer you could either, type another letter, or even run another program while it printed. TW-80 has, what appears to be, a 32K spooler which allows you to dump, and then edit another text file. I'm assuming the spooler is only 32K because it locked up after sending several 8K files to the spooler.

In summary, if you do some heavy duty word processing I would probably recommend spending a little more and get a package written for the CoCo 3 rather than a patch but, if you are just sending a letter to Grandma or writing home from school then TW-80 should do the trick.

All of us have been irritated at times because of the limitations of RS Disk Basic. At least I have, and like many of you I've looked at advertisements for many different systems. I finally decided to invest in the price of a phone call to Spectro-Systems in Florida to ask about their highly acclaimed product ADOS-3. I've found that if you want to get something for your computer, talking to the creator of the product has no equal. ADOS-3 is indeed an incredible addition to any disk sys-The ADOS-3 disk comes with a number of files on it to help you customize the utility to your own system. The manuals provided are The enhanced functions include: thorough and are easily understood. control key single stroke commands, new commands for neater displays, simple commands like DIRP and CATP for instant printouts of your direcand enhanced EDIT capabilities. I discovered that I didn't use the DIR command because of the enhanced CAT command. This command will list your directory in two columns for easy reading of full disks. This CAT can also be compactly printed with the CATP command. This creates a two column printout that's just the right size to tape to a disk jacket

Also printed, is the amount of space FREE both on the screen and on the printer. The reason I described this is because it shows just one of the advanced features of the system. Provided is also a program for configuring ADOS-3 for your own personal system. From specifying the colors of your startup screen and startup message, to the step rate of your drives, the customizing program has it all. ADOS-3 also can support 40 and 80 track drives for you folks out there who are hampered by R.S. Disk Basic. If your worried about compatibility problems, I only found a few, but ALL the problems were solved by using the 'DISABLE' command, conveniently provided for just such a need. This command makes ADOS-3 operate just like Disk Basic. All in all ADOS-3 is a remarkable system that I've found very useful. In fact, after customizing it for my system I sent off to have ADOS-3 EPROMED for my controller. Documentation is provided with ADOS-3 to tell you how this can be done. Personally, I think all the bases have been covered by ADOS-3 for the user to make disk operation easier. For those of you out there looking for a new system, I highly recommend ADOS-3.

Review of MIKEYTERM VER. 4.7 communications program.

Are you looking for a great Terminal program that you can own without paying megabucks?.

Well, I am writing this review on Mikeyterm 4.7 to help you better understand its features and capabilities, now I am sure most of you have heard of Mikeyterm and alot of you have an earlier version of Mikeyterm. This version has some bugs fixed and has an 80 column driver for the CoCo3. This version can be used with the CoCo1,2,or3 and supports Disk and/or Cassette, does I/O through the serial port, or Parallel through the RS-232 pak, how's that! No need to add any mods to use it on your CoCo/3. Mikeyterm uses X-modem for ERROR FREE file transfer, it is easy to use. This program comes with a configure program, to let, you the user configure it to your likings, you can change cursor colors, have it startup at a selected baud rate, you can set your printers baud rate you can have your screen appear three different ways (green screen with green boarder), (green screen with black boarder), or(black screen with black boarder).

This program is Commercial Quality and can stand up to the best of the commercial programs. You can do a printout from your buffer, I've used it as a word processor also, I recomend this program for the beginner as well as the long time CoCo'ist. The documentation comes on the same disk, and is well written, and formatted, to print the doc's set your right, left, top, and bottom margines all to O and start at the top of the page, you will have a neatly done docs catalogue when you are done.





Dear Dr. CoCo,

I need help! My daughter accidentaly pulled the disk controller out of the computer while it was still on. What could it have done, and am I going to need a whole new disk controller? Thanks for any help you can give.

Dear Blown Away,

Signed, Blown away in NC

There are several things that could've happened. The worst case would be a defective WD-1773 chip, if you have one of the latest controllers. There are a few capacitors across some of the data lines that could've shorted. It would be best to check these with a multimeter. If you just have a blank green screen then you probably have a line shorted. I've seen a couple of chips do this most notably one of the 7416N chips, but any of them could do it. These are a few of the things that could have happened and possible cures.

I'm having a problem with my Old RS controller. I was working on a CoCo 3 program & stepped out for about 20 mins. When I came back the drives started acting strange. They'd sometimes save part of a file, or trash a disk completely. I didn't have the high speed poke on so that could not be it. Also it won't boot OS-9 anymore. I thought it was the cable, so I built a new one; still the same. It's not a constant thing but it worries me. Any suggestions as to what I can do? I live in Europe so there is no going down to the local Shack to get it fixed. THANX



Since you didn't say whether or not you are using a modified DOS. I'm going to assume you are not. You didn't say how old your controller is. Ok, is it just one drive that's doing it or are both doing it? If it's just one you may have a drive that's getting ready to go down. If it's both then you are probably on the right track suspecting the controller . You could have an intermittent WD-1773. You could pull the chip and clean it's socket, if it's socketed. Do all the others the same way. Sometimes, carbon tends to build up in the socket's pins. Be careful, & take care to observe the rules of static when doing this. Wear cotton clothing, avoid carpet, and ground yourself. The WD-1773 may need replacing. Check the controller after doing the above steps. Check for cold solder joints on the PC board. If you feel uncomfortable doing it have an electronics man do it for you. If these don't work let me know.

This is the section dedicated to building and upgrading the computer we all have grown to love. Dr. CoCo is your host. Any suggestions for this article may be sent to Dr. CoCo C/O The Wizard's Castle.

Hello again folks! Dr. CoCo here! This month we are going to finish putting our hard drive system together.

By now, you should have everything you need to complete the system and get it operating. Let's review what we purchased:

- 1) A Burke & Burke hard disk controller
- 2) A hard drive
- 3) A hard drive case and power supply
- 4) Cables (if they didn't come with your hard drive)
- 5) A Western Digital 1002-WX1 or equivalent hard disk controller
- 6) Hyper I/O (Optional, use if you want to access hard drive from basic)

Ok, let's get started. First, let's install the WD controller in the Burke & Burke controller. You'll have to remove the mounting bracket that's supplied with the WD controller. Be careful! Avoid static! Ground yourself, wear cotton clothing, and avoid carpet.


Now, remove the top cover from the B&B controller with the allen wrench supplied with the controller. There are a couple of spacers you need to save when you remove the cover. They will secure the WD controller when you install it in the housing.

Now, gently insert the WD controller in the slot of the B&B controller. Replace the top cover & the inserts. Now, install your cables. Replace the top cover. Take care not to pinch the cables.

Now, we install the hard drive in its case. It will mount just about like you would a standard disk drive. Be sure to use the correct size machine screws when installing the drive in the mounting brackets. Be sure and mount the drive right side up. I've already heard of cases of folks who mounted the drive upside down and couldn't get it to operate. They almost ruined their hard drive, so please be careful. The papers sent with your hard drive will show you which side is up.

Plug the power and the data cables up to the drive now. Replace the cover of the drive case after you check all connections. Plug the drive controller in slot 3 of your multi-pak. If you're using Hyper I/O, you write your device descriptors and install it in Hyper I/O. If you're using OS-9, set up your decriptor file for the hard drive.



This I hope to be a monthly column dealing with the OS-9 operating system for for the Tandy Color Computer. Anyone that would like to give input may contact me by mail at the address above. All questions will be answered in "The WIZARD'S CASTLE" each month.

What is OS-9 you may ask, OS-9 is an operating system for the Color Computer. It's much like the RS Dos that comes with the disk controller you buy for your CoCo. However unlike RS Dos, OS-9 allows you to customize your operating system.

Before we go any further we must realize that OS-9 is NOT a language like Assembly, or Basic but just an operating system. The programming languages we can use with OS-9 must be loaded in separately. These are languages like Pascal, C, and Basic OS for example.

Since I like most of the readers of "The WIZARD'S CASTLE", am only just beginning to use OS-9 I do not say I am an expert. I will be using OS-9 level 2 for most of these articles but most can be used on the Level 1 also. The main difference that I have seen is that Level 2 uses the windows, and can use the extra memory and commands of the CoCo 3 where Level 1 does not have these capabilities.


