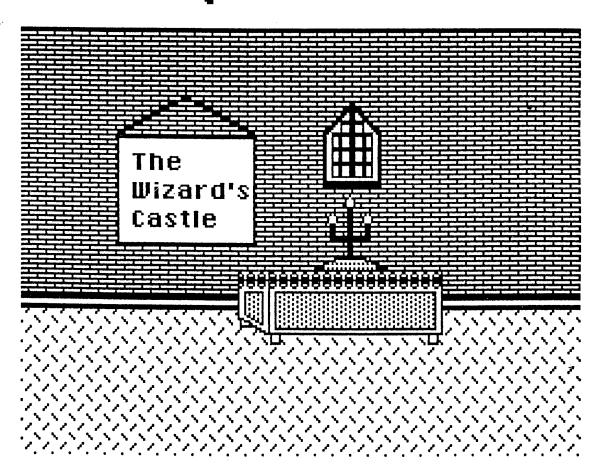

Dear Wizard,

I have no idea what, whether or not COKE will eat through nails, has to do with computers, but I would like to set the record straight. COKE and PEPSI contain phosphoric acid. This isn't one the stronger acids, but in concentrated form, it could eat through nails. Fortunately it's diluted so much that it is not considered a health threat. The fact that it doesn't eat through the can that it comes in should say something of it's strength. But, if you want ulcers I would prescribe a 12 pack of COKE /day and worry alot. I have to agree with the Wizard's solution for STUCK UPS predicament. I'm sure if CYANIDES consultant had taken more care in the cleaning he may have been able to save more data. 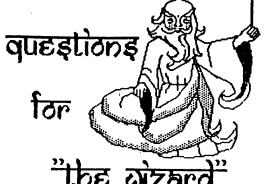

The answer to the second question is to go to your nearest post office and get their rules on Bulk Rate, or Postage Paid mailings. Usually, there is a minimum mailing required plus a Bulk Rate fee yearly plus the Bulk Rate fee per piece of mail that is mailed per month.

This month we have several different readers reviews of both CoCoMax 3, and ColorMax 3, along with a comparison of the two. I hope this will be a benefit to anyone who is trying to decide which one to buy.

CoCoMax III by Colorware.

CoCoMax III is the best drawing program for the CoCo 3. I have nothing but fun when I use it. It has many, many features like: box, 3D box, undo, circle, zoom, and many others. My favorite features are zoom, 3D box and undo. It comes with 3 disks: the CoCoMax 3 disk, a demo disk, and a font disk. If you have a 128K CoCo 3 then you will have to use a separate disk called the work disk. If you have 512K you don't need a work disk. There's a file on the CoCoMax 3 disk called 'TRANSLAT' that lets you turn CoCoMax 1 and 2 pictures into CoCoMax 3 pictures. It can also make it so you can use the pictures you make with CoCoMax 3 in BASIC. It also come with a Hi-Res Interface. If you own a CoCo 3 then I highly recommend it. It sells for \$79.95 plus \$3 shipping & handling and can be purchased from Colorware.

I don't know how many of you like to play with your computer, but I do! Sure it's a great piece of useful equipment but don't you like to party every once in a while? Well CoCoMax 3 fulfills that need in me. incredibly it is a powerful tool also. The first day I had it I could not put it down. The capabilities are endless. Draw pictures, create designs, paint, paste, circle, box, zoom! I couldn't believe the power at my fingertips. After settling down and studying the manual, which is excellent, I was even more amazed. The edit function is very powerful and can be accessed from anywhere. The zoom function allows you to make minute changes on small parts of the picture. All options are from the pulldown menus. Use of the system requires a joystick or mouse. thing that I did find that slows you down on the 128K CoCo 3, was the disk accesses for the edit and scrapbook functions. The program is so extensive it can't be totally contained on a 128K machine. I recommend installing 512K which really speeds up operation. In my opinion it is one of the most powerful, user friendly programs available. I give it 5 stars.

Here is the continuation of this months 'battle of the "MAX's". I hope this will be a benefit to any readers who are still uncertain about the best program for what they have in mind.

ColorMax 3 Deluxe from Computize.

Computize has done it again but even better. They have taken a great program and made it 'TOP GUN'. ColorMax 3 Deluxe has the same features as ColorMax 3 but it is compatible with all printers, faster, you can rotate, shrink, stretch, animation, plus lots more. One thing you must have is 512K but it's worth it. Another nice touch is to add a Koala Touch Pad. Color Max 3 Deluxe take full advantage of the potential the CoCc 3 has in the graphics point of view and is well worth the \$69.95. I definately give this program a 5 star judging.

*The Battle of the Max's", an unbiased report.

Being a graphics enthusiast, and having used several popular graphic utilities, I decided to write a review on the two best for the CoCo 3. These are ColorMax 3 and CoCoMax 3. Both Computize and Colorware claim to have the better program. I'm going to try to give you the facts. As far as tools go, CoCoMax 3 is superior. It has more tools(i.e. 3D box, 2 circle tools, ray tool,...etc). The arc tool is very well developed, and its drawing area is two screens high. I also, personally like the "density" feature of the spray-can tool. CoCoMax 3 shows all 64 colors at once when selecting colors(unlike ColorMax). The fonts and styles of CoCoMax 3 are also above ColorMax's. Now, there ARE a few good points about ColorMax! First of all, it has much smoother cursor controls, and in general operating mode, is faster. The "lasso" and "box" commands (and supplementing editing tools), of ColorMax 3 are also better than CoCoMax 3's. They seem to have less bugs in the routines, work better, are smoother, and there are more of them (editing commands). ColorMax 3 (and Deluxe) uses a standard Tandy Hi-Res Input Pak for joystick/mouse input. CoCoMax 3 uses a slightly different version. You can do a very **simple modification** to the Tandy Hi-Res Pak to use it with CoCoMax 3 if you already have one, and don't want to re-purchase it. You can write to me for details on this. The mod has a switch that lets you toggle betree¬ the original format and new. In summation, I would have to go with CoCoMax 3 when purchasing one or the other. The features are better, and though it is slower, it has more potential. ColorMax is good in that it is simpler to use(not saing that CoCoMax 3 is difficult) and it has standard features. But, for the best in graphic editors, my advice is with CoCoMax 3 by Colorware.

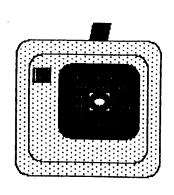

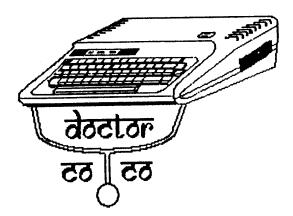

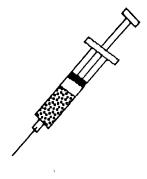
A review of "TURBO RAM"

After getting my 128K Coco 3, I soon realized that I wanted a 512K upgrade. Turbo Ram from Speech Systems was my choice. For \$119.95 you get the ram board, 16-256K by 1 bit chips, the instruction manual, a memory check program, a Musica Ram disk, and oodles of information on the GIME chip. You may also order just the bare ram board. The board itself is well designed and comes in non-conductive wrapping. The chips are already installed unless you order the bare board. The instruction manual is excellent and guides you step-by-step through the quick procedure of installation, which involves unplugging the current ram chips, clipping two capacitor leads, and snapping the board into place. After you have installed the new board, the memory check program will tell if every-If you are a true hacker-at-heart, the source code for thing is okay. the program is included just for you. The Musica Ram disk contains over a dozen quality songs plus a program which will load them all into memory and play them sequentially. Just when you think you've run out of all the good things, turn to the back of the manual for a real treat. Speech Systems has included detailed specifications on the operation of the GIME chip. At this price, I don't think you can go wrong on this offer. It is easily worth this price. If you want to upgrade your Coco 3 to its 'full potential', and get a lot more at an excellent price, I think this deal is just for you.

Dear Fran,

The IBM drive is compatible. I'm not sure about the Commodore. It depends on who made it. Since you didn't mention who made that drive I'll do what I can to help you out.

1) You need to replace the existing drive cable if it's the one that came from Radio Shack. It has some drive pins missing, and could pose a problem in the fut-Radio Shack has the materials to

ure if you want to use DS/DD drives.

make your own.

- 2) You may need a power supply cable to hook up another drive. Some of the older cases (especially the old full height drives) did not have a Power Supply splitter cable installed.
- 3) Depending on the drive, you may have to make a few modifications to make it CoCo compatible. Some you don't. Question the place you bought it from.
- 4) Set the drive select pins to 1.
- 5) Now, just hook it up like your exisiting drive. You may need a mounting kit to secure the drive in the case. These are available from most computer stores.
- 6) Try it out. If it's double-sided, you can access the back side of it with a custom DOS such as ADOS.

Hello there! Dr.CoCo here! The Wizard's Castle BBS has been keeping me busy lately. I was sitting in front of my trusty CoCo one night, and I began to think. I knew a lot of you out there have modems. Then I remembered the Wizard asking me one night how he could get a separate telephone line into the office for his CoCo. I explained it to him. Then I thought, "How many of my readers have asked the same question". Ever since the deregulation of the telephone industry, it has been legal to connect your own telephones up in your home. But, how many knew how to go about it, or where to get the hardware neccessary to do it. Well, that was the beginning of this month's article.

The addition of an another line is as simple as connecting a couple of wires. It's legal as long as it doesn't cause a problem to the neighborhood telephone service. If it does, the phone company does have the right to disconnect it.

First, determine where you want the new line to go. Then decide whether you want to mount the telephone jack in the wall, or whether a surface mount jack would be better.

Now, go to your local Radio Shack. You need to get a jack, depending on what you decided, and some '4 conductor' telephone wire. Get the round type since you may have to run the wire under the house, or you might even have to run it outside.

Now, locate the telephone junction box at your house. Look inside. Most new boxes permit access to the customer. You'll see 4 wires inside. Two of them won't be connected if you only have 1 telephone line. The wires are color coded red, green, black, and yellow. The rest of this article will be written as if you have only 1 telephone line. The red and green wires are called tip and ring, respectively. These are the wires that supply service to your home. Be careful. These two wires do have a voltage across them.

Decide which would be the best way to run the wire to your selected location. Now, strip back the wire you bought at Radio Shack. Connect the red and green wires to the same points in the junction box as the telephone company's red and green wires. Now, run your wire. When you get to where you want your jack, cut off an extra foot or two. It's always better to have too much than not enough.

Hardware Modifications (con't.)

This is the rest of the project that was started on the preceding page. Remember Dr. CoCo is your host and any articles or suggestions for this column may be sent to Dr. CoCo C/O "The WIZARD'S CASTLE".

Look on the back of your jack and you'll see four connection terminals. Four wires will already be connected. Connect the red and green wires to the red and green terminals on your jack. Mount the jack and plug in a telephone. Everything should work fine. If it doesn't, check your wiring. Also, check to be sure that you haven't cut a wire while running it.

If you already have a jack inside and don't want to go under the house, you can convert both jacks to surface mount. Then run your wire along the baseboard or just under the carpet. Be sure you secure the wire to keep it from moving around. (Even if you run it under the house it will look better if you staple it up with insulated staples). Try the line. You should be able to receive calls and dial out, just like you always have.

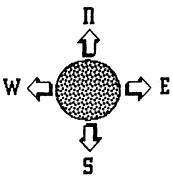
