To make your drives run at 6ms, you don't necessaritly need to have EPROMS burned (although it is handy to do it this way). Here is a method of accomplishing it without EPROMS. First, you need at least 64K of memory. Next, if you have a CoCo 1 or 2, you must enter the All RAM Mode (copy ROM to RAM). If you have a CoCo 3, you don't need to do this. To enter the All RAM Mode, type in the following routine and RUN it

Now, if you have DOS 1.1, enter POKE55232,0:POKE55318,20. If you have DOS 1.0, enter POKE54989,0: POKE55075,20. That's it. drives should now operate at six ms. If you get I/O ERRORs, you may need to go with a slower rate. For 12ms, use a value of 21 in the last 'POKE' of each of the above commands (ie: the last for DOS 1.1 would become POKE55318,21 & the last one for DOS 1.0 would be POKE55075,21). Use 22 for 20ms, & 23 for 30ms. You will have to enter the RAM Mode' and do the appropriate POKEs everytime you power up. If you press RESET when in the 'All RAM Mode', the CoCo goes back to normal. To get back to the 'RAM Mode', enter POKE&HFFDF,O. 'All RAM Mode' will allow you to change other features on your CoCo with appropriate POKEs.


REMUSIC is a program distributed by Codis Enterprises.

Those familiar with Hot CoCo magazine should easily recall a short program from years back by William Garretson that simulated brilliant fire works exploding against a black sky. It was amazing to see so many variations produced with such a brief number of lines. Well, folks, he has done it again. This time, he's transformed those throw away remarks statements or REM lines used to document programs into music. Hence the name, (REM+Music = REMUSIC). After reading only the first few pages of Remusic's thorough documentation, I listened to "Canon" and "Song". then, listed the source code of both songs to my screen. This accomplished musician/programmer has again built something amazing with a minimum of program lines. Mr Garretson's influences of madrigal harmonies, choral arrangements, and classical compositions were evident throughout each of the 3 included melodies. I cannot conceive of anyone attempting to duplicate the sounds produced here using SOUND and PLAY statements, & I feel this program far surpasses ANY music utility I've ever worked with, in ease of use & realistic reproduction of multiple voices. every reading of the manual, I grow more comfortable with Remusic's capabilities and operational commands. And, if an untrained, tone-deaf like me can enjoy this package, anyone should be able to . Due only to the limited number of compositions provided in this integrated software package, I rate it as a 9.6. Other than this, I have found no flaws with Remusic whatsoever. Remusic is truly a worthwhile investment, and its author is very professional and a person with whom business means courtesy.

Screen Star is an OS-9 word processor that works on all CoCos. have a 512K CoCo3, however, you can access the Text Formatter (extra) & Spell Checker from within the editor. The manual gives full details on loading the program, changing defaults, copying the program to a Level2 disk (the program comes on a Level1 disk), & installing Screen Star on a hard drive. I found Screen Star very easy to use. The commands are entered by pressing <CTRL> or <ALT> (<CLEAR> or <@> on a CoCo 1 or 2) & 1 or 2 other keys. There are ten user-definable macros. implements many of Word Star's functions, so if you already know Word Star, you will be able to use Screen Star without much difficulty. I was only able to find 2 drawbacks: Since Screen Star is in OS-9 format, you can not directly use it with other word processors in your system unless they too run under OS-9. Second, you must also purchase the Text Formatter for decent printouts. On a scale from 1 to 10, I would rate Screen Star a 7.

CC-THERM

CC-THERM is a digital thermometer for all CoCo's. CC-THERM 2 is a dual unit that can be used for measuring two different temperatures. For an example: You can place the 20ft long thermistor outside and the 10 foot long one inside and have an indoor/outdoor thermometer. Also it can be used to measure the temperature inside of your computer. The CC-THERM plugs directly into the 'RIGHT' joystick port and comes with software on disk & an instruction sheet which tells all about the units. If you have an extra CoCo sitting around or if you want to check the temperature occasionally then this product is perfect for you. I would recommend it in those cases. It's a neat little item to have around.

Multi-Pak Interface

The Multi-Pak is very nice to have. The main reason is because you can switch between two to four cartridges while the computer is still on. I use mine mostly for switching between the Disk Drive Controller and the Speech/Sound Pak. Some people have said that the Multi-Pak needs a pal chip that costs about \$8 for it to work with the CoCo 3, but mine works just fine without it. The Multi-Pak changes cartridges through the switch on the front or ith pokes. I highly recommend getting one if you can find one. Radio Shack has discontinued it.






I've been looking for a modem for the last few weeks, & I was wondering if you could recommend one, or tell me which one's to avoid. Also, what does Hayes compatible mean? Does that mean it'll work with a PC also? Signed, Andrew Wiest

Dear Andrew,

When looking for a modem, it is usually best to stay with a brand name. I know a lot of people out there just shook their heads, but let me explain. For people who have a limited electronics experience, a brokendown modem is not very funny. With a name brand, 9 times out of 10 you can get service on the unit. Plus, some companies such as Avatex offer a support line if you have operating problems. Now, shopping for your modem. This depends on what you will be using it for. As far as general communications, an Avatex 1200 is an excellent buy. It's small while at the same time, it won't put a strain on your pocket book. You usually can get one for under \$100. Now, for the rest of your questions. Hayes modems set the standard for modems in the industry. Period. some of the best money can buy. They don't come cheap. So, some enterprising companies saw the opportunity to "clone" Hayes modems. They're less expensive, yet perform close to a Hayes modem. We could go on for ever about communications formats, etc. but generally speaking, that's what 'Hayes compatible' means. As for a PC using them, that's what they are really made for. It just so happens that most computers can access the RS-232 port on the modem to use. The CoCo has to have a cable made to adapt it to the port but it's generally not a serious drawback. Hello fellow users. Dr. CoCo heree again. Over the past few months, I have had quite a few questions thrown at me concerning hard drives. It seems that everyone thinks that they've to be a master of OS-9 to hook a hard drive up to a CoCo. I don't blame them. I used to think the same thing when I began using my CoCo. How envious I was that those PC's could access their information so quickly. So, when I began this column, I made a promise to myself. I was determined to find a hard drive system that anyone could use. I embarked on my search. I knew Radio Shack sold a hard drive interface, but no way to access it from Basic. I Well, a while back, I stumbled across a new ad. "Build an searched on. affordable Hard Drive system with our interface. Plus, access it from Disk Basic", it read. I looked again. I couldn't believe my eyes. A company had come to our rescue! I jumped on the phone, and placed my order. I have received it and will begin work on my hard drive system. I also decided to try something different. I'm going to build my system with you. We will assemble it and get it up and running together. The next couple of months will be dedicated to "The Hard Drive"!

Now I know you're asking yourself. What's the name of this company that has heard our cries for help? Well, It's a company by the name of Burke & Burke out of Palatine, IL (312)397-2898. This company is very helpful with your questions. They'll help you all they can.

Now for the materials needed. You might want to go ahead and order your controller and software now. They have two types. One is the CoCoXT and the other is CoCoXT-RTC. The major difference between the two is that CoCoXT-RTC has a real time clock, great for OS-9 users. Plus, for basic users, you'll need a copy of 'Hyper-I/O'. This is what makes our basic miracle possible.

We need to be sure that we have a Multi-Pak interface. This controller uses 12 volts that is avaliable from the Pak. The CoCo's don't supply this voltage now. You need to be sure you have at least a 64k machine.

Let's go shopping. First, we need the hard drive. Many companies sell hard drive kits with controllers. This will probably be the way we need to go. You see the CoCoXT is an interface for a PC drive controller. If you decide to buy a hard drive package, be sure it has one of the controllers listed below:

Western Digital WD1002-WX1 (1/3 size card, MFM encoding) Western Digital WD1002-27x (1/3 size card, RLL encoding) Adaptec 2072 (1/3 size card, MFM encoding) This is the rest of the project that was started on the preceding page. Remember Dr. CoCo is your host and any articles or suggestions for this column may be sent to Dr. CoCo C/O "The WIZARD'S CASTLE".

These controllers will fit inside of the CoCoXT and perform the best. Most of the drives you will see will be of the MFM encoding type. It's not recommended to use a RLL controller with a drive that is not certified for RLL encoding. Also be sure that the controller has a standard "ST-506" or "ST-412" connection. The CoCoXT is not compatible with SCSI or SASI controller. Also question the place you purchase your drive and controller from about cables. If they don't come with the package, you will have to purchase them extra.

Now, you have to purchase a case and power supply for the drive. Again, there are many companies that sell these. You need at least a 48 watt power supply to operate one full height drive. A 65 watt supply can run 2 half-height drives comfortably. Use these numbers when talking to a salesman about an enclosure. It is not recommended that a floppy power supply be used to operate a hard drive since the amperage & wattage are usually lower than the figures above.

So, go shopping and get your stuff. Next month, we'll start assembling the drive. If you have any questions, you can reach me on the "Wizard's Castle" BBS or by mail C/O The Wizard's Castle. So, until next month, keep on hacking!
